Purpose


The U.S. Department of Education's AEFLA program, enacted as Title II of the *Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act* (WIOA), is the primary Federal program that provides foundation skills below the postsecondary level and English literacy instruction (or ESL) for out-of-school youth and adults.

The program seeks to assist students in acquiring the skills and knowledge necessary to become productive workers, parents and citizens, and transition to postsecondary education and training.

Since 2001, annual appropriations have included a set-aside for "integrated English literacy and civics education services to immigrants and other limited-English proficient populations." The WIOA, signed into law in July 2014, codifies the EL/Civics program.

Student Enrollment Program Year 2012-13



EL Students by Age




