

TES Board Report 3-11-25

Teaching Learning & Relevance

- On February 19th, eight of our teachers had a CKLA (Core Knowledge Language Arts) coach observe their classroom lessons and were provided with feedback to enhance their teaching. The overall feedback was extremely positive.
- Structured Literacy Read Alouds and Bridge to CKLA (Core Knowledge Language Arts Curriculum) Training took place on February 24th for all K - 3 staff. This training is a continuation of our ongoing Act 20 training.
- Content teams met during the week of March 3, 2025, and are making steady progress toward their goals. The ELA team continues to focus on implementing the new CKLA curriculum, emphasizing pacing and best instructional practices. The Math team has prioritized instructional strategies, with a strong focus on fluency. In Science, the team has been reviewing all units and ensuring vertical alignment across grades K-5. Meanwhile, the Social Studies team has analyzed which standards are covered in the CKLA curriculum to identify opportunities for streamlining and areas where additional curriculum development or enhancements are needed.

The Whole Student

- The b.e.s.t. Screening window closed on March 4th. The Hatchet Pride Coaches and committee will meet to review the data and determine the next steps regarding potential boosters and interventions. This data will also be analyzed through our Multi-Level Systems of Support (MLSS) process to identify necessary individual or small group interventions, as well as to recognize individuals who have met their goals and no longer require intervention.
- Attendance Matters messaging has been a consistent feature in all TES newsletters sent
 to families throughout this school year. These communications highlight the critical role
 of regular attendance in fostering students' academic and social development. The
 March newsletter specifically emphasized the importance of maintaining strong
 attendance leading up to spring break.
- The D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) program for our 5th graders began on February 21st. Over the next three months, Detective Gorell will work with students to educate them about drug abuse, its consequences, and essential skills for resisting peer pressure.
