Mid Year Performance

Most grades in our school are very close to meeting our Title/AGR goals. All grades made higher than average growth as well as achievement in our recent review of the data. We are making needed changes to keep driving improvement. We appreciate the shift towards additional mathematics tutoring and focus with the iPad reduction.

School Updates

- School Enrollment is at 360 students, and 1 more enrolling now. This is an increase of 5 in the last month.
- Based on PK Roundup Numbers we will make a projection for next year's enrollment and staffing model by March.
- We are in our 3rd round of Walk to Read, as well as Interventions school wide. Assessments are occurring for another cycle of advancement this week.
- Elementary Teachers are completing modules 6/7 in Reading Training - 4 more to go!
- Mid year district assessments are complete. Good results in - and areas to support.
- Of interest, we are planning a February Olympics Celebration/Contest Theme to encourage reading and school effort!
- Our 4th graders have been selected again to take the NAEP examination on February 10th. We have been in communication with the NAEP team and will complete the test successfully.
- Mrs. Hinze was published in the WSRA Journal - congratulations!

SUPPORTING LEARNING THROUGH OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY (OT)



Unity partners with St. Croix Health school-based occupational therapy providers to support students with disabilities in accessing their education and participating fully in school routines. School-based occupational therapy is educationally focused and provided when a student's disability impacts their ability to learn, engage with peers, or manage school expectations. Unlike medically-based occupational therapy, which focuses on health and daily living skills across home and community settings, school-based occupational therapy targets skills needed for success in the school environment and is aligned with each student's Individualized Education Program (IEP).

School-based occupational therapy helps students develop skills that directly impact learning and participation, including:

- Academic skills such as handwriting, organization, and the use of classroom tools
- School routines and self-management (materials, schedules, transitions)
- Social participation and collaboration with peers
- Self-advocacy and goal setting
- Emotional regulation, stress management, and adapting to changes in routine
- Life skills that support future learning and independence



Adjusting Goals, Strengthening Supports, Improving Outcomes



Ten special education teachers have registered to attend an "optional" after-school work session on Wednesday, February 4, 2026, to support all certified staff with the mid-year Educator Effectiveness requirements. About 70 staff members overall have signed up. It is a great time for staff to review student data, analyze and revise learning objectives and professional practice goals, collect pertinent artifacts, and network with other teachers throughout the district. LITERACY PROGRAMMING UPDATE

District

Collaborative teacher teams have regularly analyzed data to improve student learning via stronger instruction.

Elementary

Focus has been placed on improving Unity's already successful Walk to Read (WTR) Program. Emphasis on tracking student progress with responsive action has made a significant difference. Investment has also been made to get students Decodable Readers, complimenting WTR instruction and engaging students in more reading practice.

Middle School

Unity staff have engaged in FastBridge training to strengthen instructional services for learners with academic need. The core curriculum has continued to improve through intentional integration of the *Birchbark House Series*.

High School

The HS team has fully implemented a vocabulary development program, *Membean*. The team has also worked diligently to align assessment of student writing expectations from course to course.


UNITY ELEMENTARY - BEATING THE ODDS

According to [The 74](#), Unity Elementary had an expected 3rd grade Reading proficiency rate of 42% based on the 60% Free and Reduced Lunch rate in 2024. Unity Elementary achieved a 61% proficiency rate.




Unity Middle School - Star Reading

Our latest Star Reading Winter Assessments showed that 69% of middle school students scored at or above the 40th percentile in reading. More importantly, the Median Student Growth Percentile was 58.




UNITY ELEMENTARY - STAR READING

76% of students in grades 1-4 scored at or above the 40th percentile or above on the Star Reading Winter Assessments. The Median Student Growth Percentile was 56, indicating systemwide growth.



UNITY HS - PRACTICE ACT, READING

11th Grade Students took a Practice ACT Test in late January. Results from the Practice ACT indicate our Juniors are poised to achieve the best ACT Reading score UHS has accomplished in the last 6 years.
