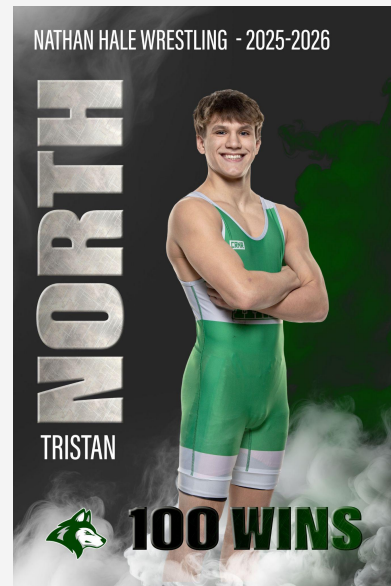
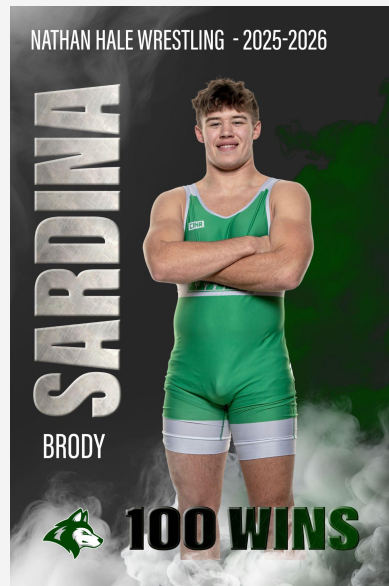
# West Allis Central Boys Basketball

Central will take on Westosha Central this Thursday. The location and time are to be determined.



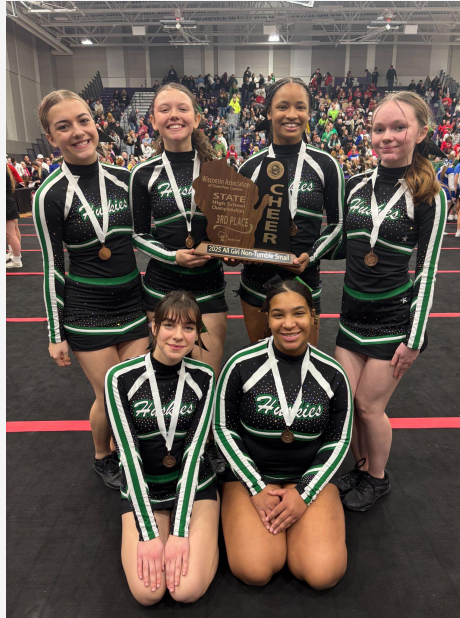

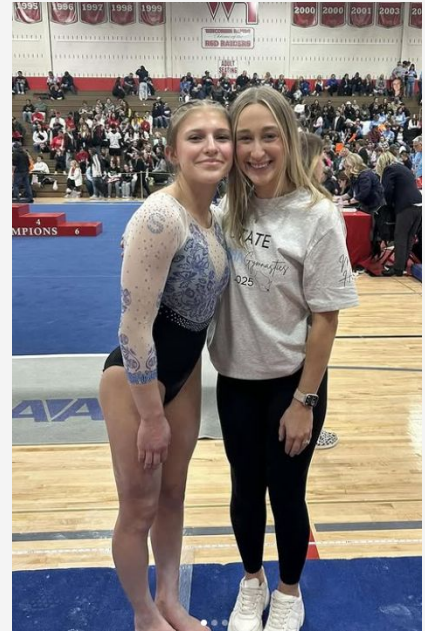

Congratulations to Tristan North for finishing 3rd in individuals!

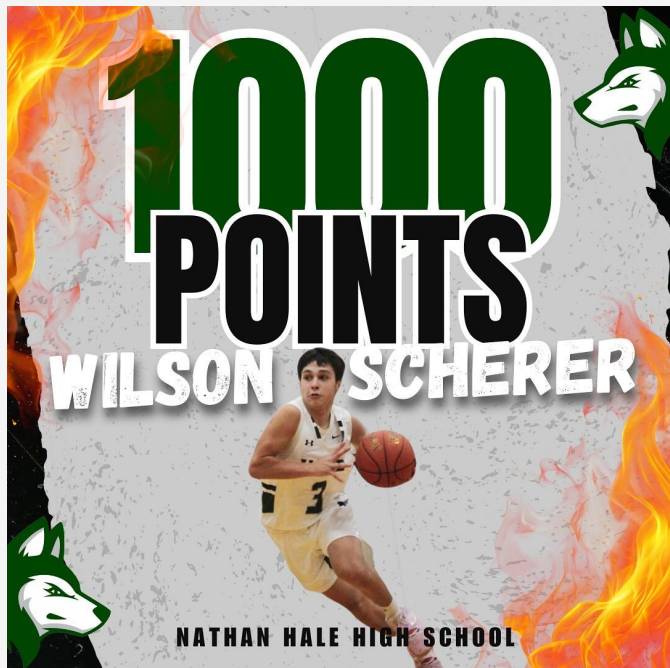
Congrats to Kya Krueger- Kya is the first female wrestling state qualifier in Hale history!

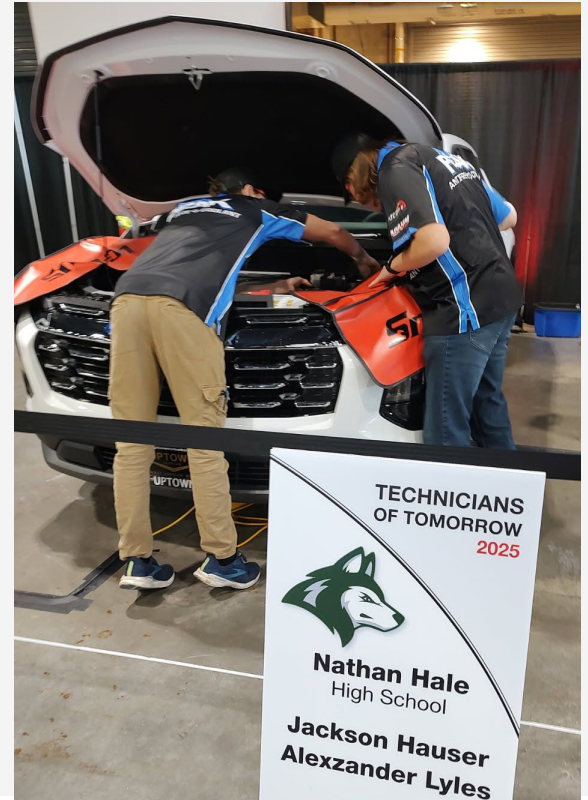
# 1,000 Career Points
