- 4. District Utilization Proposal
  - Dr. Yarbrough presented a proposal for district utilization, citing declining enrollment and financial deficits. Enrollment trends and comparative enrollment in buildings in the district were discussed. It was highlighted the impact of underutilization including increased per

student cost and the need for right-sizing. Scenarios for aligning enrollment, instruction, and building capacity were reviewed, with scenario 7 being the recommended option.

Dr. Michelle Erb discussed the educational impact of the proposed plan including benefits for early learning, special education and intervention programs. The proposed plan allows for better alignment of enrollment capacity and program access across schools.

The financial considerations, including the need to reduce operating costs and prioritize facility conditions were discussed. The proposed plan aims to balance classes, provide ESL services to all buildings and ensure long term flexibility. Next steps are to hear from the community, staff and parents' feedback on the proposal. Three public hearings will be announced to hear the feedback. December 15, 2025 is the Board Meeting for the Board to make a final decision on the proposal.
