## Services estimated above do not include:

- \$ Any program operational costs including additional classrooms, utilities, classroom supplies and equipment, computers, printers, specialized equipment and supplies for special education students, protocols and testing kits, etc.
- \$ Specialized Services for Blind/Visually Impaired students (ex: Specialized equipment, Orientation/Mobility Training \$150.00 \$200.00/hr, Braille Instruction, etc.)
- \$ Specialized Services for Deaf/Hard of Hearing (Sign Language Interpreter \$50.00 \$75.00/hour)
- \$ Specialized equipment and Assistive Technology for special needs students (as required)
- \$ New high needs students that might impact a particular program and existing staff.
- \$ Consideration of quality of programs provided to students. Many students who currently participate in Specialized COSSA Shared Special Education Programs would simply have to provide <u>additional Educational Assistants</u> rather than a full program. A COSSA Shared Program is one that is housed at one school/district and COSSA Special Education students who are eligible for the placement are provided transportation to the program. Ex: High School TLC Program @ COSSA Academy. The program is located at COSSA Academy, but special education students from all five COSSA Districts may be placed there, depending on their individual needs.
- \$ Combining grade levels (K-12) for specialized programs such as Special Day Class Severe and Therapeutic Learning Center (Program for Emotionally Disturbed) students. It would be inappropriate to have 3-5 year olds 21 year old students in the same high needs special education programs.
- \$ Tier II/III RTI Interventions and services provided by Special Education staff.
- \$ Special Education Teachers and Assistants: Additional duties (supervision) as assigned by Principals.
- \$ School Psychologists: Crisis Intervention (as needed), Non-Special Education Assessment, observation and support to general education staff and participation in school Student Assistance Teams.
- \$ TLC (ED) Programs Interim Alternative Educational Placement (emergency placements)
- \$ Special Education Administrative support (Special Education Director, Special Education records, SDE and Federal reports and requirements).
- \$ Alternative Educational Placement Homebound services for expelled special education students or medically fragile students. Interim placement for evaluation, observation for behavioral crisis students expulsion, violent, weapons (not identified as ED eligible).
