Discussion of University of Seville Student Teaching

Dr. Jerry Thomas, Dean of Education at UNT presented information regarding this international exchange program and thanked the Board for approving this partnership with UNT and Denton ISD. Four student teachers arrived from Spain's University of Seville. The University of Seville students will be mentored by DISD teachers at the following campuses Hawk Elementary, Denton High School, and Guyer High School.

Discussion and Dr. Mike Mattingly, Asst. Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction Review of Hope, Engagement & Well-being Survey along with Dr. Debra Nobles, McMath Principal and Shaun Perry, Navo Principal – gave an overview of the Hope, Engagement, and Well-Being student poll results. It is part of the district's Gallup Poll engagement. They presented the results of the 2012 Gallup Student Poll in the following categories: Nation, State, Denton ISD, and each Denton ISD middle school. Each campus will have the opportunity to administer the Gallup Student Poll annually each fall at no cost to the school or district. Each school will determine action steps based on poll data.

School Finance Lawsuit/ Legislative Update Dr. Wilson stated that Judge John Dietz announced his ruling on the Education Finance lawsuit stating the State of Texas system that is used to fund public schools is unconstitutional. Judge Dietz went on to say the state funding to Texas school districts is inadequate and allocated unequally and that local officials have no true discretion in setting their property tax rates. The decision marked the second time in a decade that the state's school finance system has been ruled unconstitutional by Texas courts. The trial, which began in October of 2012, involved more than 600 school districts that sued the state for adequate financial support.

Dr. Wilson discussed HB5 which was presented by Representative Jimmie Aycock and SB 3 introduced by Senator Dan Patrick will be two education bills the District will watch closely. House Bill 5 and Senate Bill 3 would allow more local control to allow End of Course exams to count 15 percent of a student's final grade in a course as well as cut down on the number of EOC exams needed for a student to graduate.

2012 STAAR and End of Course (EOC) Results Dr. Mike Mattingly, Asst. Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction presented the STAAR results from tests administered one year ago. The results for the STAAR are based on the phase-in passing standard. Eventually, the passing standard will be raised to the final (higher or more difficult) passing standard for each test.

All STAAR results in Denton ISD for "all students" in English were above the state performance. All Denton ISD EOC exams were above the state performance excepting Algebra I. Algebra I performance tied the performance at the state level.

Dr. Jamie Wilson, Superintendent explained the impact on the school district in relation to area charter schools. Several charter schools had recently

requested from TEA to increase their enrollments.

Core Source was the online enrollment vendor for the self-funded plan and worked with the district and TRS/BCBS to complete the enrollment process with TRS ActiveCare for the first year. TRS ActiveCare/BCBS must be notified by February 18, 2013 as to the enrollment vendor to be used by the district. The District has interview four of the five TRS approved vendors. The Board of Trustees was provided a spreadsheet comparing the various vendors and related services.
