Ms. Fleisher gave updates from the recent Auditor visit. She shared minor changes to implement regarding spending on grants. No corrective action needed. Next week we expect the first tax payments and a quarterly timber payment. Current revenue estimates are tracking well. Dr. Reed praised Ms. Fleisher for her work projecting district needs while working on the levy.

SUGGESTIONS AND COMMENTS

Superintendent Dr. Reed

Dr. Reed reminded that there is no school tomorrow for the Veteran's Day Holiday. He thanked all board and staff veterans. He has met with all schools during October and is seeing the same trend with students still needing extra care. Esther Troyer and Mary Lynn Marden should be listed as retirements, and he thanked both of them for all they have done for so many students. He shared an update on Oregon's tax code being affected by the Federal tax code update. This brings a shortfall of \$800 million to Oregon. Our Governor asked all departments to look at a 5 percent reduction. This type of reduction affects Neah-Kah-Nie's services from Northwest Regional Education Service District (NWRESD) as well as positions funded from the Student Investment Account (SIA) and High School Success. These could see substantial cuts. These fund counselors, coaches and the family resource coordinator positions. He reiterated the need to send letters of support to the legislative body. No definite reductions at this point, just a starting point.

Board Secretary, Ms. Wheeler

Reminder the board of the first phase of the Superintendent Evaluation. Instructions have been mailed and emailed. Due December 1, 2025.

Ms. Tyrer - Happy Thanksgiving, best for everyone.

Mr. Allgeier shared a successful Neah-Kah-Nie Coast Art Music and Cultural Foundation benefit he recently attended. He is thankful our district has such a variety of after school opportunities for our students and activity bussing.

Ms. Aeder gave an update on the recent Oregon School Board Association (OSBA) conference she attended. Gave a brief description of the many breakout sessions she attended, entertainment and key takeaways. She appreciated what other school districts are doing to increase family involvement. During board meetings we should refrain from making statements about an individual staff member, even when it is positive to align with public comments guidelines.

Dr. Schultz attended his first OSBA conference and focused on different breakout sessions. The presentations he attended were eye opening and full of ideas. He expressed joy in the Outdoor School video that was shared and hopes to find ways to support this important program. He is thankful for how well our board works together and our district ethics.

Ms. Bayouth-Real shared that the grand opening of the new Aquatic Facility is next Saturday from 2 to 4 p.m. She is excited about aligning swim lessons with PE standards as the swim program manager. They are always looking at expanding what NCRD can offer NKN students.

Yukon Norris (virtual) gave a sports and club update for October. She shared all of the wonderful student engagement activities that have taken place. Future Business Leaders of America club opened a new coffee shop. A very busy month for students with 78 % involved in some club, activity or sport.

Ms. Scalabrin reflected on the importance of college exposure and praised advisors for arranging trips to college campuses. College shapes a person and strongly encourages college-bound students to take advantage of opportunities to visit campuses.
