The enrollment process includes meeting with families to create student learning plans, ordering academic materials, and checking out technology. August and September are typically our busiest enrollment months and so far, we continue that trend. We will begin DIBELS testing at the end of August.

School Improvement

PACE continues to use our A3 goals to guide our work for the year. Last year we focused on implementing the *AK Reads Act.* This year, we will focus on the goal that states, "PACE will provide parents with a greater knowledge to educate children." Objective 3 states that 90% of PACE families are proactive and self-sufficient with work samples, quarterly grades, and Purchase requests. This includes submitting work samples on or before the due date. The last available data showed an average of 85% in on-time work samples. This goal will be achieved by providing training to parents through videos, Zoom calls, shared examples of what is needed for work samples, and coaching in the use of technology and MyPace for

www.paceschool.net 866-864-5491 reporting. The extra personalized support at the beginning of the year will ensure they understand what they need to submit, why it is important, and how it leads to student success.

We will continue to work individually as a school and with the district as a whole to adjust and implement our MTSS plan.

The first PACE inservice of the year will be held virtually in early November.
