

# Babb Elementary School Board Report June 11, 2023

K-2 Classroom: JoAnn Powell

Kindergarten's focus on math was analyzing, comparing, and composing shapes. First grade focused on addition to 100 using place value understanding and varied place value strategies for addition to 100. Our end-of-the-year AimsWeb data showed that we had no students in Tier 3 (Red). We were so excited at our results. Having Mary Buck as our Consultant these last two years, truly helped us learn multiple strategies to enrich our math lessons.

In ELA, Kindergarten students have been actively engaged in initial phoneme addition and deletion. They have been using these skills to read CVC words in stories, lists, and word walls, often in partnership with their peers. They have also been learning about animal habitats. First graders, too, have been working collaboratively, focusing on phoneme deletion and addition along with consonant blends and digraphs. They have been partner reading to improve their fluency and have been learning about how people work with animals.

In writing, students continued to work on learning to identify and color-code the introduction, beginning, middle, end, and conclusion of a personal narrative. This will help students incorporate these areas into their own writing.

This month's SEL focus was on mindset shift (self-awareness). Students reflected on situations and considered fixed mindsets that might affect that experience. Then, students could practice shifting to a growth mindset using personal strengths.

Babb Elementary had its end-of-the-year trip on May 12, 2024. Students went to Flipping Family Fun in Great Falls. They had pizza and got to spend time at Giant Springs State Park. Many family members joined us on this trip.

To end the year, we had our annual Awards/Picnic on May 30, 2024. Many family members were able to join us for this event. Students received attendance, honor roll, and overall year achievement awards.

In May we finished up all of our testing. On the 13th we went hiking in St Mary with the park rangers. On the 15th we had our end of the year trip to the Flipping Family Fun in Great Falls. 




### Reading and Math Tier Transition data:









Grade 1 Math:




Grade 1 Reading




Grade 3 Math




Grade 3 reading






