	Denton ISD District high school students recently competed in their respective regional UIL academic meets and accounted for 16 team and individuals - who qualified for the UIL Class 5A and 4A state academic meets. In 4A competition, Denton High claimed the highest school honor, finishing as the regional runner-up for the third consecutive year with 136 points and Guyer High scored 99 to finish fourth. Discussion of 2007 Bond Authorization Update	Debbie Monschke, assistant superintendent of administrative services, presented the Board with options on the estimated bond capacity for the 2007 bond package. Mrs. Monschke offered a conservative estimated bond capacity of \$50 million on an annual tax valuation growth of \$250 million.

Local funding is estimated at \$107 million, State funding in the amount of \$86 million, Federal funds at \$2 million with a total estimated revenue of \$200,838,064 for 2013-2014. Ms. Monschke also reviewed the Summary of Budget Changes for 2013- 2014. Expenses totaled \$196 million with a total of proposed budget changes in the amount of 8.5 million with a total of \$205 million for the 2013-2014 proposed expenditure budget leaving the District with a deficit budget of 4.5 million.

1 <sup>st</sup> Quarter Growth Report	Rocky Gardner of Templeton Demographics presented the Board with the results of the growth report for the first quarter of 2013. Mr. Gardner said home sales are up 19 percent and prices up 7 percent for the Dallas-Fort Worth area, helping Denton ISD rank third overall in the area in annual home starts and closings. The district currently has more than 2,600 home lots currently under development and more than 14,000 future home lots. The current growth report projects an increase of 822 students for the 2013-14 school year, giving the district just under 26,700 students. Mr. Gardner said on a conservative projection, the district can expect to grow by 4,500 students and exceed 30,000 students within four years. The numbers also show that by 2018, Ryan and Guyer high schools will have enrollments of more than 3,000 students and Denton High School almost 2,500.

	students at 93.45 % followed by $11^{\text{th}}$ grade students at 94.71%. The highest attendance averages are in the 5 <sup>th</sup> grade, 96.92% followed by 4 <sup>rd</sup> grade, 96.85%. The 5 <sup>th</sup> grade has had the highest attendance percentage each grading cycle.
