

- As lacrosse has grown in Duluth, the club leagues have continued to decline
- Duluth boys currently participate in the Minnesota Boys Scholastic Lacrosse Association (MBSLA) at the high school level
- Duluth girls currently participate in the Northcentral Schoolgirls Lacrosse Association (NSLA) at the high school level

- There are presently 14 teams in the MBSLA
- There are presently 7 teams in the NSLA
- In 2015 there are **73 MSHSL** boys lacrosse teams and **74 MSHSL** girls teams
- Club leagues continue to decline

- MBSLA has become more of a developmental league
- Duluth has developed a very successful program
- With only 14 club teams it's difficult to find competitive teams to play
- Many games aren't competitive leading to lopsided scores
- Players are not able to develop in game situations



- Hermantown actively working to develop MSHSL co-op program with Proctor, Cloquet, Esko and Carlton
- Grand Rapids MSHSL team soon to transition

- Development of high school sanctioned teams will encourage growth in girls program - Equal footing with boys



- 61% of boys program from Duluth
 School District boundary
- 88% of girls program from Duluth
 School district boundary
- Addition of lacrosse may bring kids back to Duluth School District
- Numbers at youth levels will support continued growth – lacrosse is not going away

Vision

Overall Vision for our program will be to: Provide the opportunity for girls and boys to learn and enjoy the sport of lacrosse and to honor the game by instilling the values of sportsmanship, scholastic achievement, and individual development since student/athletes have been proven to do better in school & society

Goals

- Lacrosse on equal footing with all of Duluth's sports programs
- Self-funding for <u>four years</u> then we revisit the situation with school board
 - Strong history of funding our program
 - Manage significant budget currently
 - Will reduce expenses in some areas with high school team
 - i.e. field rental

Goals

Protections to Prevent Loss

- Title IX Compliant girls lacrosse program will grow with high school support. With decline of girls club league, girls lacrosse may cease to exist without school sanctioning
- Volunteers for otherwise paid tasks to lower operating budget
- > Booster club will fund raise to supplement program needs
- Pre-fund each following season Make a deposit to fund lacrosse program into school's account on or before a specified date – no costs to the school
