Subject: Snow Removal Bid

Late this fall our contractor for snow removal, Roberts Snowplowing, informed us that the owner is retiring and the company is no longer doing snow removal. As a consequence, the district published a bid for the snow removal and salting services for the district. Although several contractors did a pre-bid walkthrough and two (2) chose to submit a bid. Everest Snow Management and Seasons.

The following chart details the results of the bid, for comparison I included our pricing last year from Roberts. Roberts did not do transportation last year.

*Everest's bid was non-conforming, it provided a total price as follows: South Campus \$59,360; Central Campus \$83,795; Admin Building \$6,402; Transportation \$41,392. This far exceeds our total cost of snow removal in the past several years.

After reviewing the bids, the administration recommends awarding a 1-year contract with 2 renewal years for the district's snow removal and salting services to Seasons. They come recommended from District 201 who has used them in the past but are now going in-house. Furthermore, Seasons own their own equipment, whereas Everest subcontracts the work.
