Superintendent's Report**

Student Support:

Enrollment has increased by 4 students since last months report.

District Operations: The district has been asked by the facilities department to demolish and remove the four buildings on the Elaine campus that are no longer usable to the district. An asbestos test has been conducted and 3 of the 4 buildings have tested positive. A quote for abatement has been obtained. When a quote for demolition has been obtained, it will be presented to Commissioner Oliva for approval.

- 3rd Grade -** Math - 93% of students showed growth
Reading - 87% of students showed growth
- 4th Grade -** Math - 56% of students showed growth
Reading - 60% of students showed growth
- 5th Grade -** Math - 55% of students showed growth
Reading - 83% of students showed growth
- 6th Grade -** Math - 83% of students showed growth
Reading - 61% of students showed growth
- 7th Grade -** Math - 83% of students showed growth
