This letter is regarding the Minico Science Club's fundraiser and spending.

Members of the Science club pay \$10 dues to join the club. This is not enough money to pay for all of our activities throughout the school year. (We like to have at least one activity per month and we like to have food at our activities.) Therefore, members are asked to participate in one fundraiser early in the school year – usually in October. We sell items from one of two catalogs, both of which are operated by the same company. We use either the Uncle Jerry's t-s or Natures vision catalogs. The goal for each student is to sell 12 items from the catalog. Depending on which items they sell, this could raise anywhere from \$40-\$100 per student for the club.

We use the money for the following activities:

- Two all day field trips: the destination varies, but we have gone to Boise and Idaho Falls in the past. The club pays for the bus and the entrance fees to the museum or wherever we go.
- This year we hope to attend Physics Day at Lagoon in May of 2017 & the club will pay for the bus & entrance fees
- A trip to the CSI Planetarium at night-the club pays for the bus and the show
- Pi Day celebration-we eat pie from Perkins-paid for by the club
- End of the Year pizza party-the club buys the pizza
- The club purchases t-shirts for those students who meet the fundraising goal-those who don't do the fundraiser must buy their own shirt if they want one
- The club gives a \$300 scholarship to the Science Club President for the year.
- The other activities vary from month to month depending on the president's ideas/plans. Usually, the club pays for food and supplies for any crafts or activities we do.

Because the amount of members we have every year varies, we cannot set a specific goal for fundraising, nor can we say the exact amount we will spend during the year. We do try to spend approximately the amount we earn each year, however. If we have a particularly good year, the club will pay for lunch or dinner on the field trip, but if not, the students pay for their own food. We also like to keep a little extra in the fund so that we have money to pay for our first field trip of the year, which we try to take prior to doing the fundraiser.

Here are the numbers for last year. Assuming we have approximately the same amount of members and fundraising as last year, our numbers for this year will be about the same.

Minico Science Club 2015-16:

- 96 members
- Made \$960 from dues
- Made \$1077 from fundraiser
- Spent \$2223 on the activities similar to those listed previously

We know that a gun raffle could look like a red flag, but we would like to explain how the fundraiser would be organized, and what the money would be used for. We have given this much thought, and also talked to several people, including two wrestling coaches, who have done this kind of fundraiser before in their schools. We anticipate selling 1000 tickets, and each ticket will cost \$20. We will then raffle 25 different guns to people in the community **18 years of age or older**. We don't intend on actually purchasing guns, and having them available at the raffle. Instead we would purchase gift certificates, from somewhere like Sportsman's Warehouse, that can then be used to purchase the guns. This way the winner of the gift certificates, and raffling them off rather than exchanging the guns at the school. This also insures all federal requirements would apply in order to receive the gun (**ie. pass a criminal background check and be 18 years of age**).

We estimate making \$10,000 after guns are purchased, and the raffle is conducted. The funds would be used to buy new championship singlets for our varsity wrestlers to wear during the finals of a tournament. We would need to buy 15 singlets with an estimated cost of \$2000 for the championship singlets. We would like to buy new Cliff Keen warm ups for the varsity team to use this year. The estimated cost for the warmups would be about \$3000. We would set \$2000 aside for team travel to the state tournament. We are staying at a hotel close to the Idaho Center, and we had to pay the difference for these rooms. We feel this is important for the team because the hotel is within walking distance from the arena, and that way the kids that make it to state will be able to have access to the hotel during the very long two day tournament. We are anticipating a great tournament in which they will be hanging a banner come February. The additional \$3000 will be used for off season tournaments and camps (not sanctioned by IDHSAA). The days of being a three month athlete are over, so these off season tournaments and camps are vital in creating championship style athletes and teams.
