The Board of Trustees of the Midway Independent School District met on November 19, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the Midway ISD Administration Building located at 13885 Woodway Drive, Woodway, TX 76712. President Pete Rusek called the meeting to order.

5. Recognitions

5A. November Recognition Days

Superintendent Chris Allen acknowledged National American Indian and Alaska Native Heritage Month along with several other significant recognition days that were celebrated throughout the month.

5B. State Cross Country

The Board congratulated MHS senior Caleb McCarver for his strong performance at the 2024 6A state cross country meet. Caleb placed 84th out of 151 of Texas' top high school runners. Midway High School Boys Cross Country is led by Coach Jon Capron.

5C. National Merit and College Board National Recognition

The Board recognized Midway High School National Merit and College Board Recipients. National Merit Semifinalists are Alastair McGrath and Ty Roenfanz. National Merit Commended are Esther Kim (perfect ACT score), Lucy X. Lu, and Alistair MacGregor. 6. Information Items.

6A. Security Plan for Prohibited Technologies

Following state guidelines, Midway ISD has adopted measure to restrict the use of specific applications and hardware associated with security risks, including TikTok, Kaspersky, and hardware by Huawei and ZTE. This is intended to protect sensitive data and prevent potential surveillance.

7. Presentation/Discussion Items

7A. Annual Financial Audit Report

Clayton Rogers with Pattillo, Brown & Hill, presented the annual audit report. The auditors issued a "clean" opinion on the financial statements, meaning in their opinion that the financial statements are materially accurate. The auditor's reports on internal control and compliance disclose no findings or material weaknesses.

7B. Monthly Finance Report

Wesley Brooks, Assistant Superintendent for Finance, presented the monthly finance report. Expenditures for the first four months of this Fiscal Year are lower compared to last year. The current adopted budget is a deficit of \$2,486,397.

Through the first three months of the school year, District enrollment has decreased approximately 39 students from the previous year's enrollment.

7C. Proposed MISD 2025-2026 Calendar

Dr. Becky Odajima, Assistant Superintendent of Teaching & Learning, summarized the calendar development process as well as highlighted the major differences between the calendar drafts. Staff members will be polled to determine which calendar draft is preferred prior to the December board meeting when final approval will be requested.

7D. Legislative Priorities

Dr. Allen discussed the district's legislative priorities and the needs of our schools as we approach the start of the 89th Texas Legislature session. The district faces challenges due to inadequate state funding and the push for a school voucher program. Dr. Allen stated the basic allotment of \$6,160 per student hasn't increased since 2019 along with inadequate state funding of transportation, special education, and safety.
