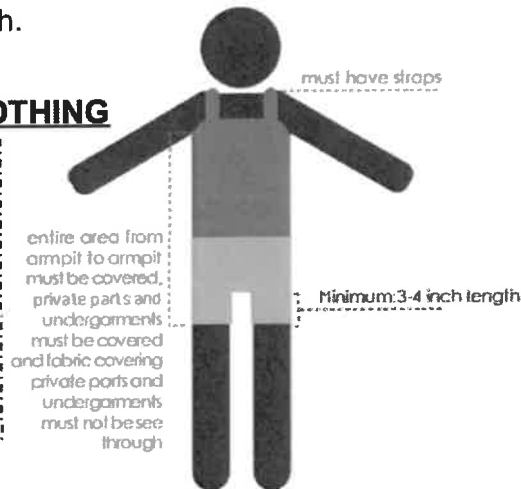
## SPRING PICTURES

**HOMework POLICY:** Students are asked to read 20 minutes every night, record their time, and have a parent sign for full credit. The homework log is turned in every Thursday.

Students will have a spelling test every other Thursday, (Thursday, May 4th is the next test). They can study their spelling & vocabulary words any way they choose, in addition to completing the attached practice pages.

**CURRENT FOCUS:** We will be discussing "What traits do successful people have?" in our text "*Riding Freedom*". Compare/Contrast and Monitoring/Clarifying are our target ELA skills & strategies. In math, students are using models and strategies to add and subtract mixed numbers.

Also, please continue working with your child on mastering their math facts, as these are extremely important as we progress through our math skills.

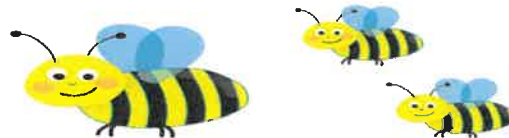
