Just for fun, here's the elementary class's new favorite game: Sharks and Minnows. It's an oldie but a goodie.

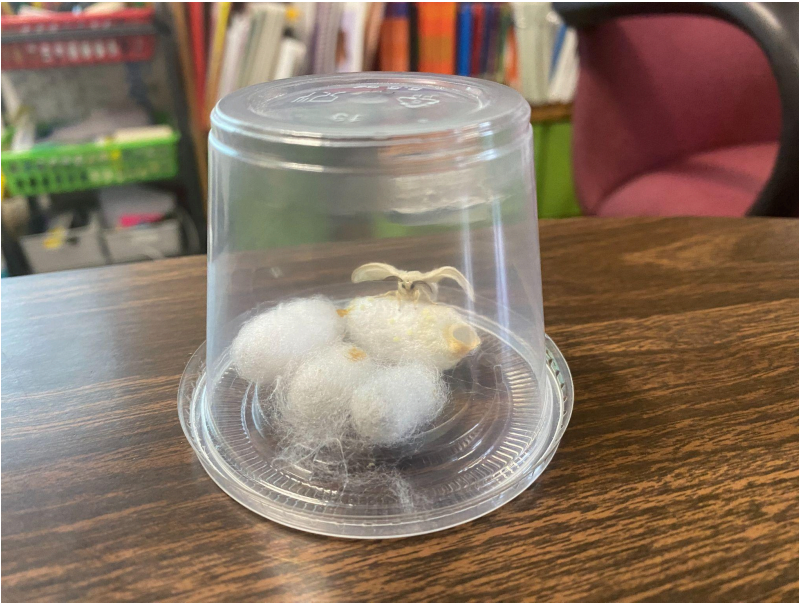


Personnel
