Proposed Options to Balance Student Contact Time

In order to accommodate instructional time lost during early release days an additional 5 minutes per school day is being proposed.

Possible Options for Elementary Assessments

K-5

September 27, 2017 and October 4, 2017

- Students are placed based on Spring Data
- Individual Instruction can be refined at this time
- oGives students a chance to recoup skills lost over the Summer
- Guides Direct Instruction sooner and helps with differentiation
 - Increase efficiency of instructional time
