Objectives

- 1a. Use annual assessment data to adjust the curriculum to meet the needs of the students in the student groups.
- 1b. On an annual basis, involve teachers in data analysis and review of curriculum alignment based on current standards. Communicate out strengths and weaknesses by grade level.
- 2a. Annually evaluate the Children's Center.
- 2b. Set annual targets of increasing the number of third grade students reading at grade level with the aim of having 90% of students reading at grade level by the 2019-2020 school year.
- 2c. identify the tools we are going to use each year: Data Star, FAST, MCA, ACT, attendance and behavior best practices; Balanced literacy, co-teaching, reading and math interventions.
