We have worked diligently the past three months to keep our focus on best instructional practice and maintaining high yet realistic goals for the school year. Since coming to Fruitdale Elementary I have been impressed with the overall professionalism in the classroom and the teachers' willingness to do what is best for our students. We are currently engaged in staff development related to best practice in math instruction.
