Federal State Strategic Priorities Goals supported through Index 1:


District Goal 1: Our actions will support the non-negotiable of Academic Excellence.

- A continuum of Professional Development that supports the foundational levels of learning for teachers and students.

- Differentiated professional development for staff with different levels of experience.
- Full time SAS counselor for all campuses PK-12 (some were added 15-16 school year).
- Additional secondary ESL aides were added this year to increase support for recent immigrants.
- Addition of ESL Campus Facilitators at campuses with high enrollment of English Language Learners.
