

- Increase percentage of students reading on or above level to 43%




#### BOY 2017 VS. BOY 2018

#### Kindergarten

- Kinder students were assessed on these preeading skills:
  - letter naming
  - initial sounds
  - blending words
  - segmenting words
  - rhyming
- Students were grouped according to data and are receiving instruction to acquire these pre-reading skills.
- Kindergarten will give their first "reading" assessment in December.
  - Goal is for students to be reading on a level A or a level B.
