GOAL 1: THE DISTRICT WILL STRIVE TO PROVIDE THE BEST EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

• Fall Assessments

Our annual fall assessments wrapped up in late September and early October. We will utilize the information from our Fastbridge fluency assessments, MAP comprehension assessments as well as the curricular assessments to differentiate the instruction and gauge learning levels. We also utilize the SAEBRS (Social, Academic, and Emotional Behavior Risk Screener) and mySAEBRS is a brief and efficient tool for universal screening of student risk for social-emotional and behavioral problems for students. These screeners are bcompleted by the homeroom teachers after getting to know their students for at least a month of school. We hope to utilize this data to provide intervention supports utilizing a Tiered model similar to our reading and math interventions.

• PreSchool Screening

The first of two fall pre-school screening days took place on Wednesday, Oct. 5. Our preschool staff welcomed a full day schedule of preschool students and parents as they participated in these needed routines. An additional date is scheduled in November for the public school rosters followed by two dates for parochial and non public preschoolers.

• Unity Day – Wednesday Oct. 19 -

Ms. Todd, our k-6 Guidance Counselor, has been working with each classroom on our anti bullying curriculum as part of their grade level instruction. This instruction includes a national awareness day called Unity Day which promotes kindness amongst all students.
