

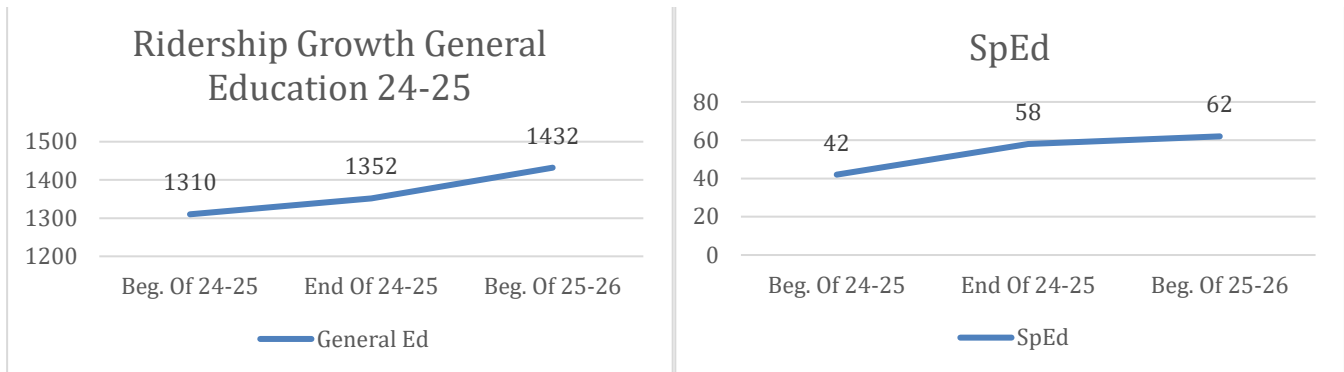

Growth in Ridership

While overall student enrollment remains steady, we're seeing a significant increase in bus ridership — up by 122 students compared to last year. To maintain our goal of no more than 55 riders per bus, this rise in demand means we'll need to add additional routes to ensure safe, efficient and timely transportation for all students.

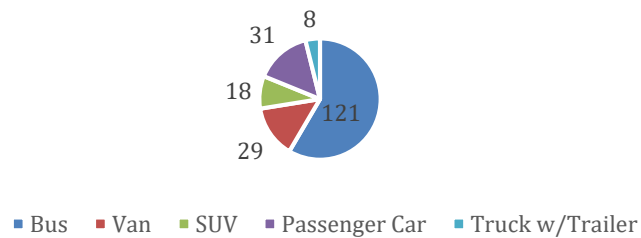
We're starting to have enough staff to add new routes, which will reduce double run routes and help distribute students more evenly.



Field Trips from 8/1/25 through 9/26/25

Successfully processed 151 field trips, utilizing a total of 207 vehicles — including 121 buses and 86 vehicles from our Auxiliary Fleet. Among these were two long-distance trips for Friday Night Lights, where we ensured all participants — Band, Cheer, and Drill — arrived on time. This was made possible through strong teamwork and coordinating coverage of home-to-school routes to free up drivers. In total, 28 drivers have supported trips during this period.
