Sikstumiksiipokaaks collaborated with Mrs. DeRoche's Home Ec Teacher to do dry meat cutting. We had meat donated from the Commodity Office and from Mr. Armstrong. It was an exciting ordeal for the kids. The plan for my Immersion Class was to cut dry meat, make it, and then use the dry meat to make pemmican. However, our pemmican was slightly altered to the kids' liking and we made it into a somewhat pemmican jerky chew. Many did not like the berries. All did not agree on eating tallow and some added a little sugar.

The kiyii (dry meat) was cut perfectly by 5th graders. They will have future skills to be awesome dry meat cutters that are really needed today. The high schoolers were great. They were my extra hands and eyes to help with monitoring the class. My class did show great respect to the high school. They loved seeing many of their role models. Some of my students cut out all the older kids. I was a little worried about younger kids handling knives, but they showed they are capable of doing the project.

The whole process is a slow process and the kids wanted dry meat right then. Then they wanted the permission right then. This was a good teaching of patience. The cultural skills I teach the kids will be skills they can work on perfecting in the future. These skills can and will carry them in the future. I tell them they can later use it for an income. I want to thank the high school and Mrs. DeRoche for allowing my kids to use their facilities. It is the perfect setting for cutting the meat. Also, Thank you to the kitchen staff for the lunch. That probably was their highlight, eating and seeing the big kids.
