	ELAR specifically, with over 60% scoring at the meets level already in December. We know						
	that STAAR sets many of the passing standards as low, but we celebrate student achievement						
	in December and look forward to using data to make things even better with our sites set on Meets and Masters percentages. The goal is to build momentum as we move into the Spring
