**DHS students recognized at national journalism conference**

Denton High students attended the recent Journalism Education Association's National Journalism Conference in Boston and placed in several competitions.

Three students placed among the top finishers in three separate categories, competing with more than 6,000 students.

These students included:

**George Roberson**, senior, was awarded a Superior rating in the news editing/headline writing category. This marked the second consecutive year he was awarded the highest honor possible.

**Chandler Elsbecker**, junior, was awarded a Superior rating in sports writing.

**Jordan Gill**, junior, earned an Honorable Mention in feature writing.

**Football team honored for winning back-to-back state championships**

Guyer High School's football team made history this season, winning the UIL Class 4A Division I State Championship for the second season in a row – the school's first time to win back-to-back state championships in any sport.

The Wildcats finished the regular season with an 8-2 record to claim the District 5-4A title. The victorious season continued:

- In the opening round of the playoffs Guyer defeated Saginaw 69-7 to earn a bi-district title.
- In the area round of the playoffs, the Wildcats beat Waco 42-13
- In the regional competition, they beat Amarillo 63-21.
- Guyer then clinched a spot in the state semifinals for the fifth time in six seasons with a 53-28 victory over Birdville - in a game that was rescheduled twice because of icy conditions.
- In the state semifinals, the Wildcats defeated Highland Park 22-16 in a dramatic come-from-behind victory, scoring all 21 of their points in the fourth quarter.
- In the state championship against undefeated San Antonio Brennan, the wildcats scored the first points and never trailed beating the undefeated team - 31-14.
- The Wildcats finished the season winning 14 consecutive games and defeated their playoff opponents by an average of 30 points and ended the season with a 14-2 record.

Guyer players, coaches and staff have established the school as one of the premier football programs in the state, having won two state titles, played in three state championship games and reached the state semifinals five of the eight years the program has existed.

The Guyer coaching staff includes: John Walsh, head coach; Mitch Stovall, offensive coordinator; Lee Vallejo, Jr., co-offensive coordinator; Derek Ramsey, defensive coordinator, Casey Hubble, co-defensive coordinator, and Oschlor Flemming, special teams coordinator.

The assistant coaches include: J.D. Aaron, Jeff Barnett, Jeff Grindle, Zane Jillson, Kyle Keese, Cory Maxwell, Fred Norris, Russ Phillips, Brian Valenzuela, Rick Wesson and Mike Weatherford. The trainers are Jeff Jones and Janna Roper.
