From The Principal

Dear Neah-Kah-Nie Middle School Families,

Tomorrow marks the end of trimester 2! As a reminder, Friday, March 8, is Grade Day for teachers, and a No-School Day for students. Report cards will be mailed out next week.

Monday, March 11, begins our third and final trimester for the 2023-2024 School Year. In this trimester, many things are happening. First off, beginning at the end of April, we will be conducting our State Assessments. As a reminder, students in grades 6-8 will be assessed in English Language Arts, and Math, and 8th graders students will also take the Science assessment. These assessments are the tools and practices we use to collect and interpret the information we need to make decisions about our instruction, and how we can better meet the needs of our students.

The state assessment schedule is as follows:

* April 29–May 3 - Students in 8th Grade will take the Science assessment during their regularly scheduled Science class.

* May 6-10 - All students will take the ELA assessment in their English class.

* May 13-16 - All students will take the Math assessment in their Math class.

Please help us ensure all students have the opportunity to complete these assessments during the above scheduled dates, by scheduling any appointments outside testing dates and times.

May 17 is our Day of Service event. This day has been a long tradition at the middle school, however because of Covid, it has been placed on hold for the past five years. We are super excited to begin this tradition again this year. This annual event is a day when our entire school community spends a portion of their day giving back to the community. Students are grouped into small groups and are taken to various sites throughout our community. At these sites, students pull weeds, wash fire trucks, paint fences, lay gravel, whatever is needed by our community partners.

Students return to the school around lunchtime and enjoy a delicious lunch provided by a community partner.

As you can imagine, this takes a ton of planning and organization. I am happy to share that our amazing **Parent Group** has taken on the job of contacting the community partners and setting up the places our students and staff will support. **First Student** has donated the busing for this day. **Thank You** for all of your support. To help ensure this day runs smoothly, **we need parent volunteers** who would be willing to join a staff member at one of the sites. The hours for this event are 8:45-12:15. If available and interested, please call the office.

Finally, the third trimester is filled with many field trip opportunities for our students. Thanks to the Mudd-Nick Foundation, our students will visit a Winter Hawks game, a Thorns game, a Maritime Museum visit, a Hatfield Science field trip, and many more.

Positive Self-Talk - Nurturing Positive Self-Talk in Your Teenager

One thing that we can all fall into is negative self-talk! As adults, we are often trapped by this and we tend to let it hold us back in life. These habits all start in our younger lives. Your children are at a great time in life to learn to recognize and combat negative self-talk. Negative self-talk can have a significant impact on your child's mental health and well-being. It can lead to feelings of anxiety, low self-esteem, and even depression. As a parent, you get to play a crucial role in helping your child develop positive self-talk. Positive self-talk is a technique that involves changing negative thoughts and beliefs into positive ones. Here are some tips to help your student develop positive self-talk:

- Encourage self-awareness: Encourage your child to become aware of their negative self-talk. Teach them to identify when they're being too hard on themselves or engaging in negative self-talk -
- Use positive affirmations: Encourage your student to use positive affirmations, such as "I am capable," "I am worthy," or "I can do this."
