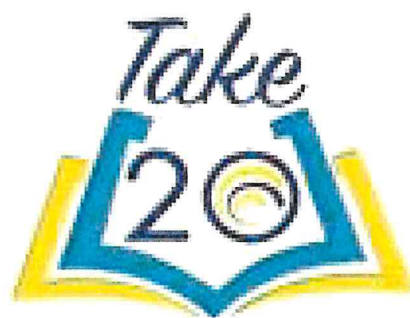
❖ Scores in the 90th percentile on standardized tests
