Meeting Agenda Item Notes

<u>Department Updates:</u> The meeting will include updates from Food Service Director Vickie Speltz and Dan Buege, who has been hired by Dashir Management to be our onsite Facilities Manager.

November 7, 2023 Election On the agenda are action items to approve Nancy West as our Election Administrator and the Elementary School as the site for Absentee Voting. Absentee Voting will begin September 26th. I am working in coordination with the Winona County Auditor-Treasurer and our election attorney to assure all legal notices and procedures are followed.

Thank you to Board members, Principal Riebel, Principal Hanson and community members who have attended our informational table/display at the Crossings Center on Wednesday nights. An informational handout about the upcoming referendum will be mailed to residents in the next few days.

I am looking for individuals, small or large groups to schedule referendum informational presentations. The only specific one I have scheduled at this time is September 20th to the Lewiston Chamber of Commerce. Please think about potential audiences to help us inform voters on the questions.

HVED Purchase of Winona Mall/Amended Joint Powers Agreement The process continues to move forward for the Hiawatha Valley Education District to purchase the existing Winona Mall to become a one sight school for the Level IV programs, some low incidence programming and staff offices. HVED Executive Director Deb Marcotte will be at our meeting to answer questions. This is an action item on the agenda. This JPA needs to be approved by all 12 school districts for the purchase to move forward. Each school district is voting on this in August.

2023-2024 Handbooks There are several 2023-2024 Handbooks on the agenda. We will highlight the changes at the meeting. The handbooks are part of the attachments to the agenda.

OTHER ITEMS

<u>Early Childhood and Child Care Programs Reorganization</u> As we have discussed, it has been a goal to make our early childhood education and child care programs more 'seamless' to increase consistency, staffing efficiencies and overall quality. On the agenda, is the resignation of Kelli Loveless who has been our Cardinal Club Coordinator which we were not expecting (career change for Kelli) and we thank her and wish her the best.

With this staffing change, we are transitioning to 'one' Coordinator with Vicky Greden being our "Early Childhood Education and Cardinal Care Coordinator." This includes the school readiness preschool program, Early Childhood Family Education program and our before/after/summer child care programs. Vicky will be teaching preschool 3 days per week (Tina Sand and Courtney Frikke will also be preschool teachers) and also providing leadership in the programs with curriculum planning, scheduling of staff and children, parent communications, assuring compliance with legal and quality standards, supervision of Cardinal Care staff, etc.

August 19th, 2023 School Reunions School Tours



<u>Business Office Activities</u> We are busy preparing for the audit next week. This requires much preparation and gathering of documents and information. I will have the 'disclosure' letter that each of you need to sign at the meeting. Sheala is also very busy with setting up contracts for the new staff, and many other required reports. We are going out for insurance bids as well that will be opened in mid/late October. Teacher negotiations are in process.

Another School Year Begins! I look forward to having all staff and students returning for another school year! We will have an all-staff breakfast August 28th – please attend if you can. I will be doing a 'welcome back' presentation @ 8:15. Some of the most significant changes this year include now operating as a two – site district with 5th graders at the elementary school and the 6th graders at the high school, the change to Dashir Facility Management services, working towards a very important referendum vote in November, some new staff and the re-organization of our early childhood programs.
