RE: Bilingual Program Update

The bilingual self-contained teachers in grades K-2 from Lincoln, Melrose and Stevenson Schools met on Tuesday, April 13th to discuss the bilingual program literacy chart and the alignment to the state requirements for native language instruction and transition into English reading. Teachers are instructing students using the district's general curriculum with the accommodations in native language per state requirements. Transition into English reading takes place during the second semester of first grade and increases throughout the rest of the grades. ESL is taught from day one. All the strategies used in the general curriculum are also used in the bilingual classrooms. Teachers administer DIBELS and all other benchmark assessments as required from the general curriculum. We will continue to meet in order to establish a non-negotiable document that will ensure that our ELLs continue to receive a solid base in literacy and transition into English reading. Attached is the bilingual reading chart. Our next meeting is scheduled for Monday, April 30, 2012.

A Bilingual Parent meeting was held at Garfield School on Wednesday, March 15, 2012 at 6:00 p.m.
