State Champions

Mahtomedi High School has won the Real World Design Challenge (RWDC) state championship for the 10th time, and this is the ninth year in a row. The Teams' next step is to compete in the RWDC National/International Championship on May 3.

The teams have been working since October to design an unmanned aerial Vehicle (UAV) that can easily transport supplies to an active wildfire location.



Team Zephyr Aerospace Products (ZAP) won the state competition, earning them a spot in the national competition. ZAP team: Tim Schussler (Captain), Luke Vipond, Benjamin Hammond, Max Newcome, John Aufderhar, Yeupheng Lee, Charlie Dehan.

Team Phoenix got second place in the state competition and was among the highest-scoring teams in the nation, earning them one of the four wildcard spaces in the national competition. 
