- Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act of010, section 205, requires School Food Authorities participating in the National School Lunch Program to provide the same support for lunches served to students who are not eligible for free or reduced price lunches (i.e. paid lunches) as they are for lunches served to students eligible for free lunches.
- Pricing paid lunches below the cost of production effectively increases Federal subsidies for higher income children because Federal funds intended for free and reduced price lunches are being used to help fill in the gap between what a paid lunch costs and what the school receives for it.

In order to ensure sufficient funds are provided to the nonprofit school food service account for meals served to students not eligible for free or reduced meals, the School Food Authority is directed to:

- 1. Compare the average price charged for lunches served to "paid" students to the difference between the higher Federal Reimbursement provided for free lunches and the lower Federal reimbursement provided for "paid" lunches.
- If the average paid lunch price is less than the difference, The Authority must either gradually adjust average prices or provide nonfederal funding to cover the difference.
