COSSA CTE Certifications

COSSA offers students the opportunity to earn certifications in Auto or Diesel Mechanics, Welding, Engineering Design, Building Construction, Culinary Arts, Health Professions such as Nursing (CNA or EMT certifications). HHS students who begin these programs their sophomore year are eligible for the certifications with the exception of CNA & EMT which are only one year programs and are open only to juniors and seniors. These classes require three periods a day and include a technical math credit.

Ag Department Offers Three Certification Pathways

The Homedale High School Ag Department, headed by Ms. Rheuby and Mr. Wetzel have put together three pathways for students which will lead to useful and powerful ag certifications. The three pathways are as follows:

Agriculture Mechanics with possible certifications in a Home Builders Association Certificate or a EETC Small Engines Certification.

Plant and Soil Science with possible certifications in Advanced Floral Certification or BASF Advanced Plant Certification.

Animal Science with certifications in Livestock Repro State Certification in the fall and the ELANCO Vet Science certification in the spring.

Student need to review the Ag Pathways document to make sure they are taking all the right courses for

these important certifications.

IDLA Courses

Taking IDLA classes is a great way for HHS students to enhance and supplement their educational experience. Over fifty dual credit classes are available through IDLA which provide both high school and college credit courses at the same time. Fast Forward funds are available to all Idaho students to pay for the college credits and the high school credit is free! <u>IDLA Dual Credit Course List</u> IDLA classes can be a way for students to meet the two credit technology requirement at HHS. IDLA classes may be taken for elective

credit, or foreign language class, or for required classes. Students may register for a maximum of two IDLA classes/semester. The \$75.00 fee must be paid before the student can be enrolled in the class. Students may have the \$75 fee waived if the class is an overload or 8th period class. HHS students can enroll in IDLA summer courses. Next ACT Test Day at HHS Saturday is April 17th

The next ACT test day at HHS is on Saturday **April 17**th. The registration deadline for the April 17th test was March 12th. Students have two opportunities to take the ACT using a fee waiver. One waiver is used spring of a student's junior year, the other waiver is used the fall of the student's senior year.

ACT Test Day Protocols:

On ACT test day, the HHS library entrance is open for students at 7:30 a.m. Students should arrive no later than 7:45 a.m. for check in. Students are to bring two #2 pencils, an approved calculator, a photo ID. Students are encouraged to prepare for the ACT by visiting <u>http://march2success.com</u>. Idaho students have free access to the online ACT test prep course and may access that by logging into the ACT account they set up when they registered for the ACT. Another test prep option is to visit the new test prep site is for ACT and SAT called the Prep Factory. Students may access it by visiting <u>ACT & SAT Prep Factory</u>







ISAT Testing this Spring The 10th graders will be starting Interim ISAT testing on April 14th. At HHS we are continuing to utilize ISAT Interim Assessments to help students fill in the blanks or to help them build on prior knowledge in preparation for the ISAT state assessment. 10th graders will take English and Math tests. The 11th graders will take the science test on April 20th. Make up days are scheduled for later in April. The state of Idaho has made applying to Idaho schools an easy process with seniors able to apply to all the Idaho colleges through one application. Transcript Request Instructions:

After applying, seniors must request that their transcripts and test scores be sent to the colleges they have applied to. Seniors accomplish this by logging into Google Classroom, opening the Gear Up to Go On classroom and finding the Google document named Senior Year Transcript Request (7th Semester) shared with them from Mrs. Flaming. They will enter their name, the date, and the schools they want the transcripts sent to. Mrs. Flaming will send out transcripts within a day or two of the request. THE LIGHTFOOT FOUNDATION

The Lightfoot Foundation Scholarship Deadline is April 15th!

The Lightfoot Foundation Scholarship assists students in the Treasure Valley who wish to go to college and further their education. THEY ARE ONLY AWARDING THIS SCHOLARSHIP TO THE FIRST 500 APPLICANTS! What are the Lightfoot Foundation's scholarship requirements?

- 1. The Lightfoot Foundation requires students to have a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
- 2. Students must be graduating from a high school from one of the approved 58 towns or cities listed on website. (Homedale is on the list).



- 3. A student's family's household gross income must not exceed over \$110,000 a year.
- 4. Students must plan on enrolling in 12 or more college credits each term/semester/quarter.
- 5. Students must submit a COMPLETE online scholarship on or before April 15th each year.

The Foundation funds are distributed at the sole discretion of the Board of Directors. The amount received by qualifying students may vary year by year.

THE SCHOLARSHIP CYCLE OPENS ON 3/1/2021 AND CLOSES AT MIDNIGHT MST ON 4/15/2021

MARCH 1st was the DEADLINE for APPLYING for the Idaho Opportunity & Governors Cup Scholarships

The Opportunity Scholarship awards eligible applicants up to \$3,500 per year and is **renewable for up to four years.** The Governor's Cup Scholarship awards eligible applicants up to \$3000 per year and is **renewable for up to four years.** To be eligible students had to have their FAFSA submitted by March 1st. Both the Idaho Opportunity and Governors Cup Scholarships must be applied for each year. Students will be notified in April about scholarship offers for the 2021-22 school year.
