NOTE: Pricing is not included as a category for evaluation. This procurement requires that there be a professional engineer licensed in the State of Texas on staff; professional engineering services are listed as a professional service under the Texas Professional Services Procurement Act (Tex. Gov't Code Ch. 2254). For such services under the Act, the District is prohibited from requesting pricing from professional engineers at this stage in the procurement. The District can only request pricing from the top-ranked proposer once the ranking is approved and then attempt to negotiate a fair and reasonable price with only the top-ranked proposer. If a fair and reasonable price cannot be negotiated, then the District must terminate negotiations with the top-ranked and move on the next-ranked before requesting pricing from the second ranked, and so on.
