| Josh Robinson Superintendent | The state budget (Act 19) reserves \$50,000,000 for a new literacy and reading improvement program to be created. Act 20 was signed into law in July. It creates statutory language creating the Office of Literacy within the DPI, the Council on Early Literacy Curriculum (advisory council to the DPI), and provisions related to reading coaches, early literacy assessment and intervention, and curriculum. Act 19 and 20 bring about greater structure to early literacy and reading improvement across the state. Frederic's HMH and related instructional materials are expected to fit well into the state literacy and reading framework currently being developed. |

Supplemental professional development and coaching supporting the Science of Reading will expand to grade bands 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12, beginning at August Inservice. Title I will provide parent education opportunities through onsite learning sessions during Open House and Parent-Teacher Conferences as well as monthly video topics, "Viking-to-Viking" Family Tool Box! The RTI Team has designed an intervention calendar with 4 week fidelity checks and 8 week data review cycles.
