The state requires that the duly elected governing Board approve and adopt the terms of the annual Achievement Compact for submission by July 1st, 2013.

The Three Rivers Achievement Compact Advisory Committee met on January 9th, 2013 to develop their recommendation to the Board. The recommendation of the committee was to set goals based upon current and previous year's performance and achievement levels.
