Everyday Heroes




May cultural day and mini pow-wow





Instructional Coaches Report by Arlene Wippert and Melissa Henderson

May was a very busy month. Our students were given the Spring Benchmark assessment.

2nd Grade Reading

There was a 16% decrease in tier 3 and a 25% increase in tier 1 for 2nd grade. Forty students made the grade level norm in oral reading fluency and overall the strength for this cohort is reading comprehension.

2nd Grade Math

2nd grade decreased tier 3 by 26% and increased tier 1 by 24% for math. Their strength was scoring well in number comparison Fluency triads.


3rd Grade Reading

There was a 1% decrease in tier 3 and a 10% increase in tier 1 for 3rd grade. Forty-three students made the grade level norm in oral reading fluency and overall the strength for this cohort is reading comprehension.


3rd Grade Math


3rd grade decreased tier 3 by 7% and increased tier 1 by 7% for math. Their strength was scoring well in mental computation fluency.






W.I.N. data for intervention 3rd grade
