The Spring Budget conference will be held in Albuquerque April 9-11. The district should learn the unit value for the 25/26 SEG, the indirect cost rate and other information for the 25/26 budget.

The 120-day student count was certified on 03/24/25. The SY 24/25 120-day count came in at 10,383 FTE. In comparison to last year's 80/120-day average count on which SY24/25 SEG funding is based, the district shows a decrease in enrollment of 366 FTE.
