200 Food boxes for Christmas for families in Sheridan will be distributed

- will contain 1 turkey, fruits, vegetables and condiments.

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Kirk Hutchenson – head of Food For All – 260,000 lbs of food total will be collected throughout the state – about 5,000 families will receive help.

Spoilage – to farm animals – for those that spoil, shops heat is shut off
