- 6. Impede, delay or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the College's educational program or any other activity taking place on College property which has been authorized by the Board, President or other authorized administrator;
- 7. Enter any portion of College premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and authorized by College officials;
- 8. Bring, possess[, conceal] or use a weapon as prohibited by Board policy JFCJ Weapons in the Schools and state and federal law;
- 9. Possess, consume, sell, give or deliver unlawful drugs and/or alcoholic beverages. Possess, sell, give or deliver drug paraphernalia;
- 10. Consume, sell, give or deliver alcoholic beverages as prohibited by Board policy unless as otherwise approved by the College in certain circumstances and in advance as provided by law;

[Wear, possess, use, distribute, display or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, sign or other things which are item that is evidence of membership or affiliation in with any gang.
