What is a Crisis in our Schools?

- 1. A natural disaster causing loss of life in the school building
- 2. An accident on school grounds
- 3. A violent incident on or near the school
- 4. A violent incident involving students or faculty off school grounds
- 5. The death of a student or staff member
- 6. The death of a family member of a student or staff member

TRAUMA INTERVENTION PROGRAM (TIP) - "Citizens Helping Citizens In Crisis"

TIP is comprised of specially trained community volunteers who provide emotional and practical support to victims of traumatic events and their families in the first few hours after a crisis. TIP volunteers are called to crisis scenes by police officers, firefighters and emergency room personnel.

- Share information broadly about how and where community members and students can receive and give support.
