



- Earth/Space curriculum (4th Marking Period) involves webcast activities with engineers at NASA
 - O During these activities, students and engineers are able to dialog during 45-minute segments and participate in projects such as measuring the craters of the moon with Dr. Delaney
 - Students continue conversations with NASA engineers throughout the year
- RCMS science teachers are actively involved in re-writing the district science scope and sequence in the area of science

- During weekly Science PLC meetings, which occur every Monday, instructors share best-practices, build collaborative lesson plans, and ensure horizontal/vertical alignment

- 8th grade Science teachers are working EXTREME Science—this program is an interactive, engaging science program which includes training and lesson plans

Math

- Family Math Night: Food, math fun and prizes. Teachers collaborate and gather donations of great door prizes, Math budget provides food. Tables are set up with fun games for parents and students to play together. This year we are hoping to coordinate with UNT and utilizing teachers and interns to turn the math night into a Fiesta.
- TAKS Camp: Students stayed after school on Friday's and worked with teachers on their objectives of greatest need. The students that came to most sessions went to Main Event with us for a fun evening bowling and relationship building with them.
- Weekly PLC's: Plan lessons, target students of great need, intervene, share ideas, measure achievement.
- Campus Improvement Plan: We want to reach Exemplary. We know it boils down to a handful of students. We will work together to reach our goal by carefully monitoring.

- Content Tutor Schedule: We have a master schedule of available tutor times posted by our doors and distributed to students. If the student's teacher is not available, the student can see which teacher is and go get the help they need.
- Math instructors are exploring the use of technology to integrate into lesson plans with the use of blogs, podcasting, etc.
- Before and after school tutoring, common engaging lessons in 8th grade and Algebra
- Acknowledging and addressing the achievement gap that is evident with our LEP students in science and mathematics, our teacher are
 developing engaging lessons, which utilize differentiated instruction, SIOP strategies, and increased communication to our Spanish
 speaking families

English Language Arts/Reading

- 7th grade ELA/Reading teachers attended TCTELA and TAIR conference; both teacher brought back valuable information/resources which are being utilized in the classroom and shared with ELA/Reading PLC members to enhance vocabulary development
- 7th grade ELA teacher has attended National Writing Scoring Conference for two consecutive years—the information gleaned from the conference and shared with the department affirms the writing approaches they are currently using (and is reflected in RCMS TAKS scores)—ELA/Reading teachers are discussing ways to meet with elementary teachers to ensure they are vertically aligned in their approaches to teaching writing skills
- Read 180 instructor attended the Read 180 National Summer Institute—she has shared valuable instructional strategies from top reading specialists in the country with the ELA/Reading. The research-based strategies shared with the PLC stress vocabulary instruction, and addressing the struggling reader, and second language learners.
- Our Read 180 instructor has developed a presentation, Vocabulary Pizzaz, which she presented last school year at TAIR, Texas Association for the Improvement of Reading, and TCTELA, Texas Council of Teachers of English Language Arts, state conventions. Special note: Pam Flores, 2008 Lewisville ISD and Region 11 Principal of the Year and finalist for Texas State Principal of the Year, attended this session at TCTELA and followed with an e-mail stating, "....you did a wonderful job with your presentation......Just awesome." She requested that Mrs. Brown collaborate with her teacher, Julie Johnson who also attended the Read 180 Summer Institute. Other comments received: "Useful, practical applications," "Will take back sentence writing and sharing! It was fun and anytime we actually do something I will remember how to do it in my class. Why attend Strickland...

SMS is one of Denton ISD's oldest campuses. The school opened in 1968 and has a long history and tradition of excellence.

Strickland has the best staff in town. Every single adult on our campus is a true child advocate. The staff bends over backwards to assist the students in achieving their academic and extra-curricular goals. Staff work together to find a way to make situations work, rather than simply saying "It can't be done." Every effort is made to help the students be successful and to assist them in reaching their maximum potential.

Strickland is in the 3rd year of implementation of the Rachel's Challenge Program. This program helps students learn to embrace and celebrate each other's differences, look for the good in others and practice kindness with each other and the community. Our Rachel's Challenge Chain Reaction Teams do considerable community service within our SMS community and the Denton community as well.

SMS has received a 21st Century Grant to provide Community in Schools Extended day services for the 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 school years. Tutoring, enrichment, and structured activities are made available to 100 students.

SMS has very active FGO and GOL clubs sponsored by the ESL department. These students are learning the *Seven Habits of Highly Effective Teens* and are becoming more involved in school and taking responsibility for their own learning. We are also the only middle school with the Paths to Scholarships program for our 8th grade ESL students. This program gets them thinking about goals and attending college.

The SMS Library has 16136 resources available for circulation, with the average book age being 17 years. The average number of students visiting the library each day last year was 234. The average number of books checked out per student last year was 22.

SMS has the best fine arts programs in town. Our choirs, bands, and orchestras consistently earn superior ratings each year. Many of our students earn spots in the Region choir, band and orchestra. Approximately 60% of our students are involved in music. Approximately 32% of our students are taking an art class. Over 200 students are enrolled in a theatre class.

Strickland has the expectation that every child will be successful and will perform at his/her potential and beyond and therefore provides a full range of services for identified special education students that include: Life skills classrooms, Adaptive Life Skills, SAC, Inclusion, speech, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Adapted PE, and psychological services. SMS provides Read 180 and Dyslexia reading intervention programs.

Strickland has a very proactive counseling department. Our counselors teach classes, do individual and group counseling, and work with students on character building and learning appropriate social skills. They also plan award assemblies each six weeks to honor student with outstanding achievement and those who have made improvement.

We reward good behavior with a "Viking Gold" ticket system. Teachers and other staff give students gold tickets for good behavior or random acts of kindness that they observe. Each week we have a drawing on Friday for prizes.

Each six weeks each team selects a student of the month and school-wide the students select a teacher of the month. The Greenhouse, one of our awesome adopters, treats this group to lunch.

At SMS we have an award winning Student Council. This group and sponsor do tremendous amounts of community service, work on a campus beautification project, participate in teacher appreciation activities, organize our dances and many other fun events at SMS.

SMS has great athletic programs where students learn the fundamentals of each sport, teamwork, sportsmanship and many other essential life skills. Our programs are successful and our students have a positive experience.

SMS has an active and busy Parent Teacher Association. Their fundraising efforts include hosting a Taco Salad supper on the night of open house, Viking Day, and hosting the Night of Shining Stars which supports our STAR program. The STAR program recognizes and rewards students for academic achievements.

At SMS, the level of communication between the staff, parents and administration makes for decisions that are based on what is best for our students.

The SMS WEB program (Where Everyone Belongs) assists with 6th grade orientation and transition and provides leadership opportunities for our 8th graders.

SMS has a very student-centered staff, a family atmosphere and excellent school climate.

At SMS we are very environmentally aware. We reduce, reuse, and recycle.

At SMS we are very technology savvy. Our students regularly benefit from using five computer labs, computers in the classrooms, four laptop carts, document cameras in all classrooms, interwrite pads and flip cameras.

SMS has made tremendous progress toward our goal of becoming first a recognized school and then an exemplary one.
