#### **Mission Statement**

## Denton ISD: Empowering lifelong learners to be engaged citizens who positively impact their local and global community.

#### **Implementing the Revised Fine Arts TEKS**

Revisions to the Fine Arts TEKS in dance, music, theatre, and the visual arts, have been adopted by the State Board of Education for implementation in August, 2015. The following information summarizes the philosophical and practical importance of the updated Fine Arts TEKS:

The revised Fine Arts TEKS strands align across all four artistic disciplines as follows:

- 1) Foundations: perception and observation, inquiry and understanding, and literacy
- 2) Creative Expression
- 3) Historical and Cultural Relevance
- 4) Critical Evaluation and Response

Improvements to the revised Fine Arts TEKS are as follows:

- Provide a sequential and spiraling set of concepts across all grade levels
- Increase rigor as students move through the grade levels
- Address the higher levels of college and career readiness in meeting 21<sup>st</sup> century skill requirements
- Provide more opportunities to increase the use of technology in improving instruction and enhancing learning and understanding in and through the fine arts
- Introduce and incorporate cross-curricular concepts among the fine arts disciplines and relate these ideas to learning in other subject areas

The revised Fine Arts TEKS embody the five fluencies necessary for 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning as briefly described below (these also align with the Denton ISD Mission Statement):

21<sup>st</sup> century fluencies are process skills that students need to thrive in a rapidly changing, globally focused world. Included among these skills are such things as critical thinking, problem solving, creativity, and innovation. The 21<sup>st</sup> century fluencies are not as much about "hardware" as they are about "headware" and "heartware". These process skills are deeply rooted and heavily imbedded in all fine arts disciplines which is why they are reflected in the revised Fine Arts TEKS.

#### 1. Solution Fluency

Solution Fluency is the ability to think creatively to solve problems in real time by clearly defining the problem, designing an appropriate solution, delivering the solution and finally evaluating the process and the outcome.

#### 2. Creativity Fluency

Creative Fluency is the process by which artistic proficiency adds meaning through design, art, and storytelling. It is about using innovative design to add value to the function of a product though its form.

#### 3. Collaboration Fluency

Collaboration Fluency is team working proficiency that has reached the unconscious ability to work cooperatively with virtual and real partners in an online environment to solve problems and create original products.

#### 4. Media Fluency

There are two components of Media Fluency. First is the ability to look analytically at any communication to interpret the real message and evaluate the efficacy of the chosen medium. Second is to create original communications by aligning the message and audience though the most appropriate and effective medium.

#### 5. Information Fluency

Information Fluency is the ability to unconsciously and intuitively interpret information in all forms and formats in order to extract the essential knowledge, authenticate it, and perceive its meaning and significance.

## State and National Fine Arts Recognition for Denton ISD in 2014-15

- The Navo Middle School Treble Choir, under the direction of Mary Mathis-Sadler, performed a solo concert receiving critical acclaim in Carnegie Hall, New York City (May, 2015)
- The Harpool Middle School Band, under the direction of Bryan Stone and Heather Brannock, performed at the National Concert Bands of America Festival in Indianapolis, Indiana (March, 2015)
- The McMath Middle School Tiger Jazz Band, under the direction of Travis Harris, was a national winner for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in three years in the Mark of Excellence
- Guyer High School Theatre program received "Best Actress" recognition from the Dallas Summer Musicals High School Musical Theatre Awards for their production of "Pippin"
- 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Drum Corps International (DCI) Red River Thunder Show sponsored by the Cavaliers, Denton ISD, and the Ryan Raider Band Booster Club at CH Collins Athletic Complex which has developed into a sell-out show with approximately 6,000 in attendance

**The information** in blue below is provided to offer information about the district's fine arts programs, as well as their accomplishments and support of student achievement and overall district success in 2014-15.

#### I. Vision ... In pursuit of excellence, the district will:

- a. cultivate a network of professional learning communities addressing the educational needs of every child in our district
  - continued work of Professional Learning Communities with elementary art, elementary music, secondary art, band, choir, orchestra, theatre arts, and dance programs to revise curriculum for implementation of the new FA TEKS
  - involved Fine Arts Council reps to facilitate staff development training and select new Fine Arts instructional materials for the new FA TEKS
- b. develop and maintain a culture where learning remains our first priority
  - a primary goal of the fine arts department is to provide quality arts instruction for all students that contributes in a positive way to the education of the "whole child"
  - in compliance with state law, fine arts courses are offered K-12 to provide "a balanced curriculum designed to meet individual needs"
- c. remain committed to providing equitable and outstanding opportunities for every student on every campus
  - Fine Arts participation (Attachment A)
    - 12,875 elementary students in grades K-5 received weekly instruction from specialists in art and music (100%)
    - 12,160 secondary students received instruction in one or more fine arts classes (93.7%)
    - 579 fifth grade students participated in string orchestra classes twice a week taught by middle school and high school orchestra directors
    - district participation in one or more fine arts classes averaged
       96.8%

- two 2015 valedictorians (one from Denton HS and one from Ryan HS) plan to major in music education as a career choice
- provided transportation for the annual "Fine Arts Recruitment Day" program at each middle school campus for the district's 5<sup>th</sup> graders as they transition from elementary school to middle school
- Mariachi program update
  - 16 MS/HS students from Calhoun MS, Crownover MS, Harpool MS, Navo MS, Denton HS, Ryan HS, and Guyer HS participated in the district's Mariachi Ensemble (10 students in the performing group with 6 beginners in training)
  - Performances in 2013-14 included Denton Arts and Jazz Festival, two Cinco de Mayo concerts, LULAC meetings, Grand Prairie ISD Invitational Mariachi Festival (received a 1<sup>st</sup> Division Superior Rating)
- district-approved travel opportunities for fine arts groups
  - State—San Antonio; Corpus Christi
  - National/International—Winter Park, Colorado; New York City, New York; Orlando, Florida; Rome, Italy

#### e. develop a budget focused on student and professional learning

- provided budget worksheets and needs assessment forms electronically for secondary fine arts teachers and requested prioritized capital instrument and equipment needs for the 2015-16 school year
- provided financial support for focused and fine arts area-specific districtwide staff development training opportunities for all fine arts teachers on three designated district staff development training days in August and October
- provided substantial district funding of new band and orchestra instruments for the district's Fee Waiver instrument program which is available to economically disadvantaged students meeting qualification guidelines (Fall, 2015)
- acquired Grant Funding support for district programs
  - the director of fine arts wrote and received a district grant for 2014-15 in the amount of \$7,900 to support transportation costs for the "Getting Started With the Arts" collaborative program between the GDAC, the two Denton universities, and the school district involving students in grades 1-5

 the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade Nutcracker ballet transportation costs are provided by a special donation to the Greater Denton Arts Council and school district from Christopher and Sue Bancroft

### f. effectively communicate achievements and recognitions to the Denton ISD community

- recognized state and national individual and group fine arts achievements at regular board meetings throughout the school year
- recognized fine arts honors and awards for students and teachers regularly on the school district and fine arts web sites
- recognized fine arts achievements on the school page of the local newspaper

## g. prepare our students to be successful in a global society while instilling an appreciation for community service

- through fine arts participation students learn creative and critical thinking skills, as well as team work, self-discipline, and leadership which are all necessary for success in a 21<sup>st</sup> century global society
- fine arts groups from elementary through high school routinely participate annually in community-wide events in a variety of performing and visual arts venues in Denton, as well as throughout the DFW Metroplex and beyond (ex. Denton Tree Lighting, Denton Arts and Jazz Festival)

#### II. Teaching & Learning... In pursuit of excellence, the district will:

- a. cultivate a consistent, strong, district-wide balanced curriculum based on ongoing needs assessments that supports all students
  - continued development of elementary art and music curriculum units based on the district-adopted Understanding by Design (UbD) model
  - completed an annual needs assessment document of prioritized requests for capital equipment items to support fine arts instruction
  - continued the Denton ISD after-school Mariachi Ensemble program for middle school and high school students
  - provided the district sponsored 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Honor Choir experience with student participation from all elementary campuses
  - provided the middle school All-City Band experience through an audition process for students in preparation for TMEA Region 2 Band tryouts

- provided middle school and high school band, choir, and orchestra pre-UIL performance evaluations in preparation for UIL concert and sight-reading contests
- provided a district-wide art show for students K-12 hosted by UNT on the Square (May, 2015)

### d. establish quality staff development programs that promote professional learning communities

- utilized the district Fine Arts Council representatives, nominated and elected by their peers, to gather teacher input for professional development ideas and to facilitate staff development training and select new instructional materials to support the new FA TEKS (Attachment B)
- provided specific staff development training developed with fine arts teacher input for elementary art, elementary music, secondary art, band, choir, orchestra, theatre arts, and dance (Attachment C)
- arranged for fine arts staff development presenters, including DISD
  master teachers, master teachers from DFW school districts, faculty
  members from Texas Woman's University and the University of North
  Texas, faculty members from other universities, and experts from
  professional fine arts venues

## e. stay abreast of and incorporate best practices into teaching, learning, technology and leadership

 revised the two-year rotation schedule to provide two days of educational leave with sub costs covered by the FA Department for teachers to attend their state fine arts conference (TAEA, TMEA, TETA, TDEA); the new plan maximizes campus and district support for fine arts staff development training

#### III. Climate... In pursuit of excellence, the district will:

#### a. celebrate and respect the diversity in our Denton ISD Community

- district fine arts programs provided students with multi-cultural experiences and exposure to diverse artistic genres and styles
- district fine arts recruitment materials are provided in both English and Spanish
- offered a non-traditional small ensemble experience through the Denton ISD Mariachi Ensemble and the World Drumming Ensemble, a part of the percussion program at Denton HS

- provided annual collaborative jazz band cluster programs involving our high school band programs and their cluster middle school programs

#### d. instill in students a love of life-long learning

- fine arts students developed artistic skills and, in addition, through their involvement in the arts also learned organization, leadership, team work, self-discipline, collaboration, and motivation skills
- numerous students each year pursue fine arts involvement following high school either as a vocation or avocation; many receive substantial college scholarships for participation in the fine arts at the collegiate level
- e. motivate and prepare students to embrace their full responsibilities and obligations as active citizens of their community, nation and world
  - fine arts students are taught and encouraged to develop high-level artistic skills that will enable them to participate in arts activities in college and throughout their adult lives as community leaders who are involved, informed, and well-educated citizens

#### IV. Parent and Community Involvement...In pursuit of excellence, the district will:

- a. foster a positive and welcoming environment that encourages parent and community partnerships to achieve success for all our students
  - 8,428 students and teachers were served in the fall of 2014 through the
     "Getting Started With the Arts" fine arts enrichment series for students in
     grades 1-5 in collaboration with the Greater Denton Arts Council (GDAC),
     Texas Woman's University, and the University of North Texas

- 180 fifth grade students from 22 elementary campuses participated in the fourth "DISD 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Honor Choir" performance (March, 2015)
- collaborated with the University of North Texas string pedagogy department in offering the "String Project" opportunity for students in grades 2-4
- collaborated with the University of North Texas to offer the "Start Up the Band" on Saturday mornings to 5<sup>th</sup> grade students in the district's Title I schools—the grant provides instrument rental for the students and UNT student instructors (program had 25 participants with 19 continuing into the district's MS band program
- elementary choirs, as well as middle school and high school jazz bands, the Mariachi Ensemble, and dance groups participated in the 2015 Denton Arts and Jazz Festival
- high school fine arts groups have parent booster organizations that provided additional physical help with and financial support for district fine arts programs

  - b. recruit, select, employ, and retain teachers in every classroom because of substantive experience in the discipline they teach, rather than in auxiliary functions
    - the director of fine arts represented the district at job fairs to recruit quality fine arts candidates to interview for potential district openings
    - the director of fine arts is actively involved with campus principals and interview teams in screening resumes and filling open fine arts positions
    - the director of fine arts assisted with placement of student teachers and observers from TWU, UNT, and other universities in our art, band, choir, orchestra, theatre arts, and dance programs through collaboration with the HR Department and the campus principals
  - d. encourage all teachers and staff to pursue advanced professional development and degrees within their specialty area
    - 2 elementary music teachers completed Kodaly and Orff certification levels at SMU (Summer, 2015)
    - 1 elementary music teacher completed Orff, Level 3 certification to become master teacher

    - collaborated with Human Resources to develop an AppliTrack application process for private lesson teachers, clinicians, judges, accompanists, orchestra pit musicians for musicals, color guard instructors, percussion techs, and marching techs (2014-15)
