The first two weeks of school I have been busy taking care of two different threats to Minico High School, a battery incident at TLC, and a student that has anger issues at MHHS. The first incident was unfounded, the second incident resulted in two arrests. One student posted a request that someone shoot the school up and they received a response from another student. All other contacts at Minico were handled by the school.
