College Application Week at HHS October 12th-15th

College Application Week is a nationwide program to encourage every high school student to apply for postsecondary training. At Homedale High School, Mrs. Flaming will be visiting the senior leadership and economics classes to provide an opportunity for every senior to apply to at least one college, university, tech school during the week of October 12th. The Next Step Idaho organization has created an online program that allows seniors to fill out one application, and send it to any and/ or all of the schools in Idaho at the same time! As a follow up, seniors will receive assistance in starting their FAFSA applications. This application is required by colleges to award financial aid and scholarships and also will make it possible for students to access grants from the state and federal government. Parents who need help and support with FAFSA are encouraged to come to Parent/Teacher conferences on October 15th and to stop by computer lab 110 to complete the FAFSA. If parents bring 2019 Federal Tax returns and W2's, it will take less than 30 minutes to complete everything!

During College Application week, Mrs. Flaming will be helping seniors to log into Apply Idaho on the Board's Next Steps Idaho website, to create their own account, and open and print their personalized Direct Admissions letter. This letter will show all the Idaho public colleges and universities which the student pre-qualifies for admission. As a follow up, seniors will need to apply to one or more institutions to confirm their interest. College Application Week at HHS October is 12th-15th.

SAT & ACT for SENIORS October 2020:



SAT Test Wednesday October 14th

The class of 2021 missed the opportunity to take the SAT as juniors last spring due school closures across the state. Taking a college entrance examine is a state requirement for all juniors. The class of 2021 had this requirement postponed to their senior year. **On Wednesday October 14**th Homedale High School will proctor the SAT for all seniors during periods 1-4. Pencils and approved calculators will be provided. Test prep for the SAT can be accessed through **Khan Academy**.



The ACT test will be proctored at Homedale High School on Saturday October 24th. The arrival time is between 7:30 & 7:45 a.m. Students are to bring two #2 pencils, an approved calculator (<u>Approved Calculator List</u>), a photo ID. (A drivers license or official DMV photo ID is mandatory) and test takers need an ACT test admission ticket. (For those taking the test at HHS, Admission Tickets will be provided)

Students were given a free online test prep program called Kaplan when they registered to take the ACT. Students access this free test prep tool by logging into their ACT account at ACT Log In. (It is recommended that students log in using their Google account). Another excellent free test prep site is called March to Success and can be found at http://march2success.com

THE RED RIBBON CAMPAIGN AND ENRIQUE KIKI CAMARENA

Since its beginning in 1985, the Red Ribbon has touched the lives of millions of people around the world. In response to the murder of DEA Agent Enrique Camarena, angered parents and youth in communities across the country began wearing Red Ribbons as a symbol of their commitment to raise awareness of the killing and destruction cause by drugs in America.

Enrique (Kiki) Camarena was a Drug Enforcement Administration Agent who was tortured and killed in Mexico in 1985. When he decided to join the US Drug Enforcement Administration, his mother tried to talk him out of it. "I'm only one person", he told her, "but I want to make a difference."

On Feb. 7, 1985, the 37-year-old Camarena left his office to meet his wife for lunch. Five men appeared at the agent's side and shoved him in a car. One month later, Camarena's body was found.

In honor of Camarena's memory and his battle against illegal drugs, friends and neighbors began to wear red badges of satin. Parents, sick of the destruction of alcohol and other drugs, had begun forming coalitions. Some of these new coalitions took Camarena as their model and embraced his belief that one person can make a difference. These coalitions also adopted the symbol of Camarena's memory, the red ribbon.

In 1988, NFP sponsored the first National Red Ribbon Celebration. Today, the Red Ribbon serves as a catalyst to mobilize communities to educate youth and encourage participation in drug prevention activities.

PSAT/NMSQT for JUNIORS October 29th 2020:



PSAT/NMSQT Test October 29th

Juniors will be given the opportunity to take the PSATNMSQT October 29th during school hours periods 1-4. This test is for high achieving juniors or those juniors who are interested in extra test prep practice for the SAT. All Idaho juniors are required to take the SAT in the spring of 2021. Juniors who take the NMSQT test will have their score entered into a national scholarship competition called the "National Merit Scholarship Qualifier". The National Merit Process...following the test on October 29th the following may happen for junior NMSQT test takers:

Nothing. Juniors did not score high enough to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship, but it was good practice for the spring SAT.

They Become a Commended Student. In this situation the student is not in the running for the National Merit Scholarship, but since they impressed the selection committee with their score and academic record, they may still qualify for other scholarships sponsored by businesses and corporations.

They qualify as an NMS Semi-finalist. They made the cut...only 16,000 out of the 1.5 million who take the test actually make it this far. The semi-finalists will then be whittled down to 15,000 finalists. From there, 1,500 finalists will receive special scholarships from corporate sponsors, and 8,200 will receive the oh-so-coveted National Merit Scholarship.
