





What is Play Based Learning in PK and K?

The bill requires each school board to provide play-based learning during the instructional time of each regular school day for students in kindergarten and preschool. The play-based learning must

(1) be incorporated and integrated into daily practice;

(2) allow for the students' needs to be met through free play, quided play, and games; and


(3) not involve, predominantly, using mobile electronic devices.





