School Report Card Data:

Celebrations:

Commendable status

Math college remediation rate fell from 41% to 12%

Fall of 2021 data indicated a concern and we eliminated remedial courses and restructured Math course sequencing to ensure all students take Algebra 2.

Student attendance rose to 93.3% from 90.4%

Chronic absenteeism fell from 33% to 21.2%

Chronic truancy rate fell from 41.6% to 12.5%

All data points regarding attendance have been a focus. We have increased expectations and consequences and instituted several incentives. We have also leveraged all regional resources, ie RAP and truancy, to hold students and parents accountable.

Drop out rate fell to 4.4% from 5.7%

9th grade on track went from 80.2% to 90.8%

The graduation rate data points have also been an area of focus over the last 2 years. We revamped the summer school program and expanded credit recovery to allow students more opportunities to recover credits. We have also utilized



the Bridges and Revive programs to allow students who fall more than 1 year behind an intensive opportunity to make up credits and graduate with their class.

• We celebrate the hard work of the faculty and staff at PHS in implementing these new programs because their progress is counterintuitive to a growing Low Income population and rising Student Mobility.

Opportunities for Growth

The Graduation Rate fell from 86.5% to 83.3%.

We will continue to focus on the critical factors influencing high school graduation that we can control: 9th Grade on track, attendance and credit recovery.

The focus is going to be on the creation of a freshman At-risk classroom that will house 10-12 students who we believe will struggle to pass 5 core subjects.

We have no control over low-income status and the demographic factors proven to negatively impact graduation. Nor do we control if a student/family chooses to homeschool.

Teacher Attendance fell to 59.4%
