Administrative and Compliance Updates

- Arkansas Application (AR App) Approval: ASBVI's AR App process has successfully completed and received approval from the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) through Indistar. This milestone demonstrates our commitment to meeting state standards for accountability and program development.
- 2. Internal Control Audit: In compliance with requirements for all state agencies, ASBVI completed its Internal Control Audit, which was submitted to ensure our functional and fiscal procedures are managed with integrity and oversight in order to minimize and control risk in all operational and financial areas.

Building Project Developments

Significant progress has been made on the building project. The architect team has been moving forward on the feedback from stakeholders in order to develop an initial



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plan. Construction partners are now on board and are conducting preliminary preparations for demolition, including asbestos abatement. The architect team is now ready to receive feedback from staff on spacing options in early December. During these sessions, school personnel will engage with the team to review space layouts, discuss design options, and share preferences, ensuring that the project meets the specific needs of blind and visually impaired students.

Upgraded Sound System in ASBVI Cafeteria

Thanks to the generosity of the ASB Alumni Association, the cafeteria's sound system has been completely replaced. This upgrade greatly enhances our audio capabilities, improving sound quality for events and gatherings in this central space.
